What do we hope to accomplish?

- Know YOU are not alone in questioning how to reach out to others of same and younger generations

Religion Runs in the Family

Vern Bengtson, USC Professor Emeritus of Gerontology and Sociology

>35 years of research shows <u>a remarkable consistency</u> in the concepts of faith, despite technology and societal changes.

- 3,500 grandparents , parents, grandchildren and greatgrandchildren
- Over half of young adult children follow in the religious footsteps of their parents

This has not changed appreciably since the 1970s

Bengtson's research is used over and over again by religious leaders and educators to develop ideas for passing on the concepts of faith.



Bengtson's Study

Four Dimensions of Religiosity:

- Intensity of Faith
- Frequency of Religious Service Attendance
- Agreement with a Literal Interpretation of the Bible
- Agreement with the Importance of Religion in Civic Life

Bengtson's Religious Journey

Bengtson's father was a pastor in the Evangelical Covenant Church (a family tradition of faith that goes back to the 16th century).

Considered himself a religious prodigy; only involved in church in a very minor way as an adult

After 65 years of searching, Bengtson had a religious awakening.....'I was surprised with joy!"

Have Faith in the Faith We Follow...



Multi-Faith "Worry": We are not alone...

Research shows that Catholics, Protestants, Jews, Muslims and Hindis are all concerned about their children's carrying on their religious traditions and beliefs.

Rabbi Brad Hirschfield's advice when asked how to make sure their kids believed in God...

Better that you should make sure they know that God believes in them!



Again...Know That They Are Loved

Hirschfield reiterates Bengtson's research: Genuine faith is far more profound than verbal assent..

It arises out of life experience that confirms that the young are loved, that their aspirations are sacred, and that they are believed...

Faith in God is not a goal...but a by-product of loving and trusting experiences created by those who already possess deep faith.



Greatest Generation (born 1901 and served in WWII)	70	44	77	54
Baby Boomers (mid-1940s to 1964)	62	48	79	57
Millennials (1981- 1997)	51	46	76	55

- Afterlife: 2/3 of Millennials believe in Heaven, compared with roughly 3/4 of Baby Boomers
- Belief in the concept of Hell: 56% of Millennials believe in the concept of Hell, similar to older age cohorts

Churches should focus on the family unit: No matter the shape or size....

Take a long range view: "humbly and warmly" model your faith
