Halloween by the numbers...


Total planned spending is estimated to reach \$9.1 billion, up from last year's \$8.4 billion. Costumes will make up the largest share of spending, coming in at roughly \$3.4 billion. Men (\$96) plan to spend nearly \$20 more, on average, than women (\$77).

Pumpkin trivia..



- Over one billion pounds of pumpkins are produced each year; most in just six states (IL, MI, NY, OH, PA and CA)
- Illinois remains the leading processed pumpkin producing state, producing more than the other 5 leading states combined and about half of the national total.
- Eighty percent of all the pumpkins produced commercially in the U. S. are produced within a 90-mile radius of Peoria, Illinois. Most of those pumpkins are grown for processing into canned pumpkins. Ninety-five percent of the pumpkins processed in the United States are grown in Illinois.
- Morton, Illinois just 10 miles southeast of Peoria calls itself the "Pumpkin Capital of the World." Over 100,000 tons of pumpkins are processed and canned there each year. That is enough pumpkin to bake more than 50 million pies. See: www.pumpkincapital.com


